Plant a Monarch Butterfly Garden today

The Monarch Butterfly Habitat is easy to create by planting the essential foods that the butterfly and caterpillar eat.

What to plant:

- Milkweed: Monarch caterpillars eat the leaves of milkweed plants. Milkweed contains toxic steroids called cardenolides that make the plant taste bitter. These steroids protect the caterpillars from predators.
 - Nectar Flowers: Adult monarch butterflies drink nectar from many types of flowers, including milkweed, buddleia, Shasta daisy, verbena, California buckwheat, and black sage to name a few.

Plant Your Own Monarch Garden!

- Plant Milkweed and Nectar flowers together in a warm and sunny part of your yard and watch the magic unfold as it becomes a sanctuary for beautiful Monarch butterflies!
